Concrete track c.30ft wide running c.600ft yds in an east-west direction. According to Sir Patrick Macnaghten, on whose land it is on, it was erected during World War II as part of an artillery firing range.

Seemingly a lorry drove to and fro along the track, steel ropes being attached to its front and back. These were linked up, via pulleys, with a target bogey running on a parallel track on the headland to the north; the latter was thus dragged to and fro, providing a target for guns emplaced on the escarpment immediately south of the track. This system proved unsuccessful and was superceeded by a tracked bogey set into a cutting several hundred yards to the west.
